REFLECTION

In our readings today Jesus comes to his disciples and shows them again that he is not a ghost. Sitting down with them to eat, Jesus once again teaches them about everything written about him in the scriptures. He is clear that he is the Messiah and that they cannot stay silent, but that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. Jesus then gives the punch line - 'you are witnesses of these things'. Jesus is clear and to the point. He does not want them to back down from their calling to bring the gospel to the world. John writes to the churches calling them to focus on Jesus and make sure they keep him at the centre of their faith. He warns them not to love the world or the things of the world but to love God who loves them and has made them his children. He calls them to purity, repenting of any sin they commit immediately so that they may remain in Him. John is adamant that we who are children of God remain in God's love and follow Jesus only. He is clear and to the point. John won't back down on his call to be a witness. We have this same call. We are to be witnesses to Jesus and to keep reaching out and working out the love of God in our lives.

As we celebrate with Melanie and Blake in the baptisms and confirmation today, we come as family to support them to grow in this Christian life, which is not always easy. It requires discipline in following Jesus and a clear choice to remain pure in our hearts and minds and actions. If, however, we are following Jesus then the Holy Spirit is our strength and the place of peace through Jesus which is ours to enter and rest in, not so we can hide there forever, but so that we can walk on in faith as John did, never backing down. Today perhaps you are in need of the Holy Spirit's strength, perhaps you are aware of your shortfalls and are finding it hard to walk with Jesus right now. Perhaps the gospel is challenging to share so you're feeling it's all too hard. Remember that Jesus has sent Holy Spirit to help us. We are his family members - brothers and sisters - in whom he lives, and through whom he wants to save the world. This is a relationship in which we can go to him today and seek the grace, peace, forgiveness and strength to walk by faith and not back down: "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are." 1 John 3:1
