REFLECTION

On this Sunday we consider Jesus' declaration of himself as the good shepherd. This beautiful image of the shepherd who loves the sheep because they are his own and who will give his life to keep them safe is a powerful reminder of the sacrifice of the cross, and also as we approach ANZAC Day, the sacrifice of every man, woman and child who has responded to the call to defend our country by joining up to fight. volunteering to tend to the wounded, being part of a women's auxiliary or contributing at home by helping out in the empty places left by those who have gone to war. John's knowledge of Jesus was intimate and he was acutely aware of how much Jesus loved his own disciples, as well as the many who were not yet his followers. John understood that Jesus didn't just throw his life away for a few, but gave his life in order to save as many as would believe in him. Jesus speaks in the passage in john 10 of knowing his sheep and his sheep knowing him, and of the many who 'are not of this fold' - people who have not yet had the chance to hear the good news of Jesus and are from places where Judaism has never been heard of. People of every race, colour and belief system are sheep waiting for their shepherd to come and save them. No matter where they come from, once saved they become part of the one flock under Jesus - one body in Christ is how Paul put it. The love of our good shepherd extends past our own boundaries and reaches across the world for these lost ones. It is a universal truth which requires a specific obedience. The call has gone out to love one another as Jesus has loved us. To show our love for Jesus by showing Jesus' love to others who may not be 'part of this fold' yet. to give as Jesus did in whatever way we can so that we can fulfil Jesus' call to love our neighbour. It is not a call to war, though spiritual warfare is always part of the deal when we step out in faith, but it is a call to sacrifice. We are to be a people who serves before we seek to be served, as Jesus did. Even if that means our own lives are given away in the process. What opportunities to serve our community do you see? A neighbour who needs a shoulder to cry on or a hot meal? An opportunity for ministry which will ask a sacrifice of time and energy? People who need you to show them the good shepherd's love for them? How are we loving one another as Jesus first loved us?
